Russell Schofield, 112 W Spring, expressed concern with the City’s nuisance abatement ordinance. Schofield was directed to Police Chief Evans for the handling of his request for a compliance extension. Courtage requested some swings be raised at the park. Gould requested attention to Inger Park pertaining to yellow posts that may need to be coated. Hansel inquired about street cleaning and weed control prior to Strawberry Days. Courtage commended the volunteer who power washed the Strawberry Point signs at the City’s entrances. The roots will be removed and plants appropriate for the area can be added later in the year. Schofield also commended the City staff’s snow removal efforts.

With there being no other business, Rowcliffe moved to adjourn at 6:22PM. Hansel seconded the motion. All ayes.
